Performance Measure Project Pays Dividends

Beginning in the summer of 2009, the Wyoming County Soil and Water Conservation District conducted an assessment of stream channel erosion sites on the Cattaraugus and Clear Creeks within the Arcade Village Limits at the request of the Village of Arcade Superintendent of Public Works. This assessment was limited to the eastern portion of the Village of Arcade because the section of the Cattaraugus Creek downstream of the confluence of the Clear and Cattaraugus Creeks had been adequately protected due to previous bank stabilization projects undertaken by the Village of Arcade, USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service, Pioneer Central School District and the Wyoming County Soil And Water Conservation District.

In July of 2009, a complete Streambank Erosion Assessment report was presented to the Village of Arcade. This report was funded through the NYS Soil & Water Conservation Committee "Performance Measure Financial Project Assistance" to the District. The report identified a total of 16 potential project sites – 6 sites on the Cattaraugus Creek and 10 sites on the Clear Creek that were in need of channel clearing of trees & debris and streambank stabilization. All of the project sites were a high priority to protect public infrastructure as well as to protect private properties.

A summary of this report was submitted to the New York State Emergency Management Office in hope of securing funding through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. In the fall of 2012, the Village of Arcade was awarded approximately \$600,000 to fund the engineering, design and construction of 2 project sites on the Cattaraugus Creek and 3 sites on the Clear Creek within

the Village. In the next two years, the District worked closely with the Village of Arcade and the engineering firm of Clark Patterson Lee from Rochester, NY to develop cost estimates, engineering plans and bidding process.

In the spring of 2015, contracts were awarded to begin the construction at these projects sites. D&H Excavating, Inc. from Arcade, NY was awarded the Clear Creek sites and Keeler Construction Company, Inc. from Albion, NY was awarded the Cattaraugus Creeks. Approximately 1,770 of streambank protection is expected to be completed at all sites by the end of August of this year.
